

Frontage Along Pine Creek Added to Tiadaghton State Forest

Thanks to your continued support, another section of Pine Creek is now open for everyone to enjoy. The 11.3-acre property you helped conserve last year is now officially part of the Tiadaghton State Forest.

With 1,500 feet of creek frontage, this site gives paddlers and anglers a quiet spot to pause along the shore. It also borders the Miller Run Natural Area, creating a larger block of connected habitat for wildlife and expanding a stretch of conserved land in the Pine Creek Valley.

This addition will help the Bureau of Forestry access the area as they care for the surrounding forest, making it easier to manage invasive species and maintain healthy woodlands.

We're especially thankful to NPC member and friend George Durrwachter, whose support and connections helped move this project forward. Thank you, George, and every single member and partner who made this possible!

Because of you, another piece of Pine Creek's natural beauty is conserved for today and for generations to come. NPC's Land Stewards in Action

July and August kept NPC's Land Stewards busy! From conservation easements to classrooms, your Land Steward team was able to travel across the region visiting NPC's conservation easements and working with volunteers, landowners and partners to share hands-on conservation lessons with the community.



Zaner Conservation Easement, Columbia County.

Last year, a major storm swept through Columbia County, downing several trees along Fishing Creek on land owned by the Fishing Creek Sportsmen's Association (FCSA). Thanks to our members, NPC helped conserve this land in 2007.

Earlier this year, NPC connected FCSA with grants to clear invasive plants and prepare for replanting. Native Creations Landscape Services, Inc. treated the area this summer and will return this fall to plant native trees, keeping this important streamside forest thriving.



Nicholas Conservation Easement, Tioga County.

At the Nicholas Conservation Easement, our Land Stewards teamed up with a local forester to measure a giant Red Maple tree that could be one of Tioga County's largest. Each of NPC's 54 conservation easements brings its own special value, so it was very exciting to have a potential champion tree in our midst!

The always-popular stream table was back in action for Worlds End Day! This hands-on model shows how streams form, move, and change over time. Together with our partners at the County Conservation Districts and the Clean Water Institute, and with funding from the First Community Foundation Partnership of Pennsylvania and the Loyalsock Creek Watershed Association, NPC uses this tool to spark curiosity about healthy watersheds.
